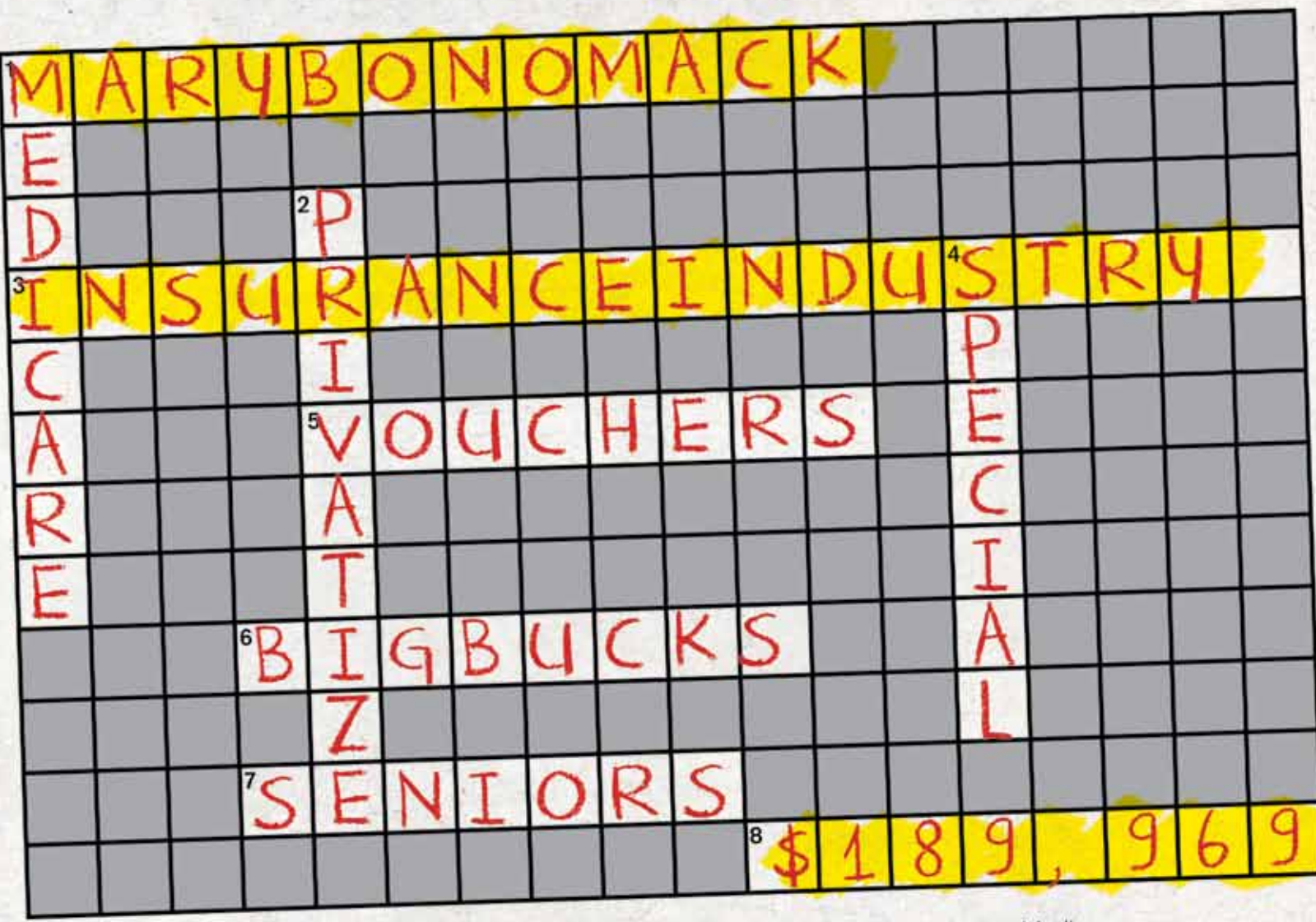

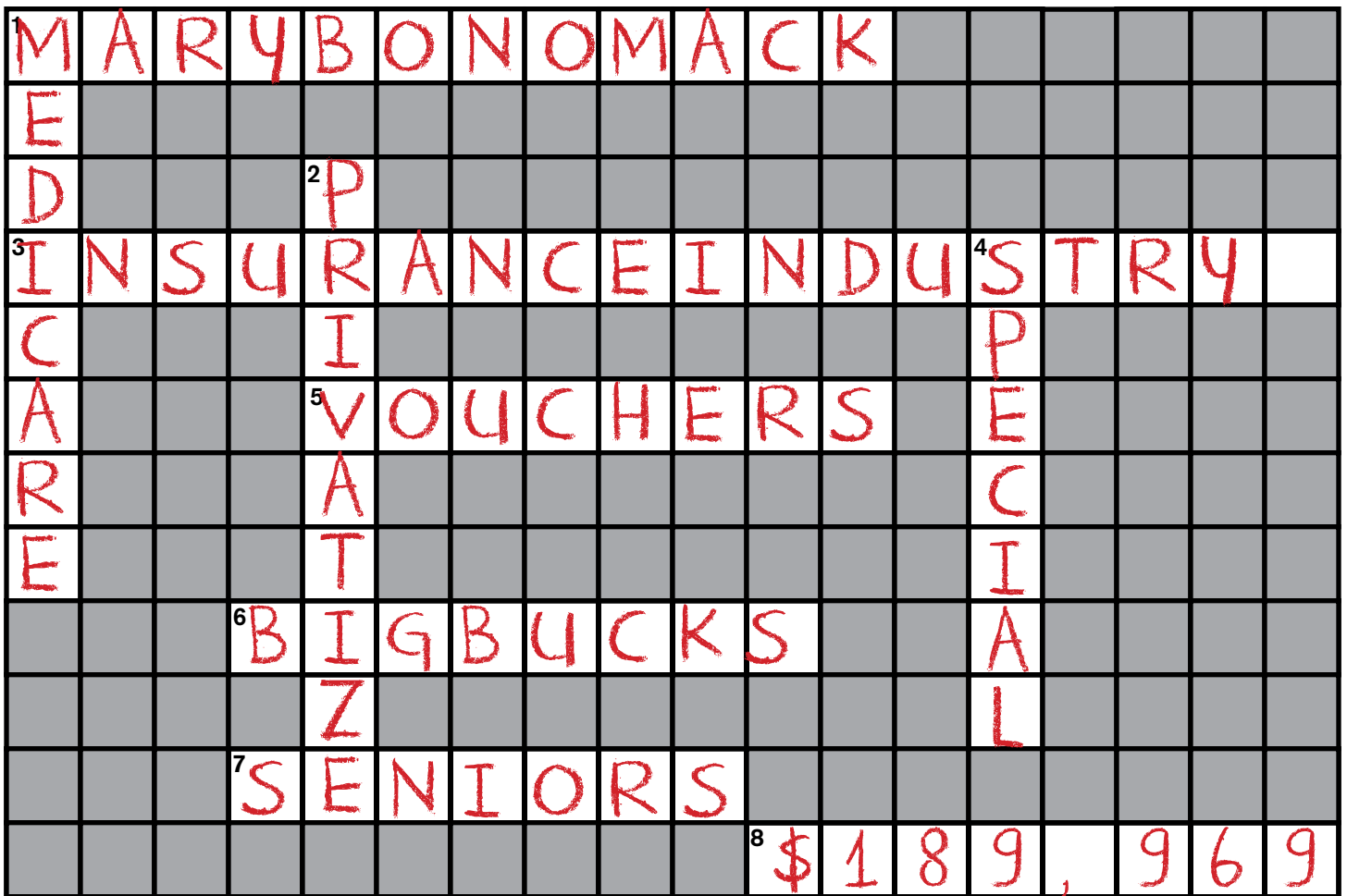
**Congresswoman Mary Bono Mack is playing a risky game
