Charlie Bass used his influence for personal profit when he:

- Wrote legislation and arranged Cabinet-level meetings to get rebates and special treatment for his nephew's energy company.³
- Bought more than \$500,000 worth of stock in that business.⁴
- Lied to the press about getting government advantages for the business he had a financial interest in.⁵
- Was paid thousands of dollars in dividends from his nephew's company.⁶
