# Congressman Quico Canseco takes care of Wall Street, not Texas.

El congresista Quico Canseco se preocupa más por Wall Street que por Texas.

**He didn't protect consumers from credit card companies, but he voted to protect the people on Wall Street who created the financial crisis.<sup>2</sup>**

**When Canseco put Wall Street ahead of Texas, there were real consequences:**

- ✗ **Opposed a plan to protect consumers against the abusive banking practices that led to the financial crisis.<sup>3</sup>**
- ✗ **After Wall Street contributed \$815,702 to Canseco's campaign,<sup>4</sup> he wrote legislation to gut the Wall Street Reform Law and make it easier for them to conduct dangerous trades that put regular homeowners at financial risk.<sup>5</sup>**
- ✗ **Tax breaks for companies that shipped our jobs overseas.<sup>6</sup>**
- ✗ **Fewer consumer protections, letting banks and credit card companies cheat middle-class families with fine print and hidden fees.<sup>7</sup>**

**It's easy to see that Canseco looks out for special interests - not us.**
