**When Canseco put Wall Street ahead of Texas, there were real consequences:**

- Opposed a plan to protect consumers against abusive banking practices that led to the financial crisis.<sup>4</sup>
- After Wall Street contributed \$815,702<sup>5</sup> to Canseco's campaign, he wrote legislation to gut the Wall Street Reform Law and make it easier for them to conduct dangerous trades that put regular homeowners at financial risk.<sup>6</sup>
